DISTRICT COACH REPORT

At the start of the season the Central committee supported the position of District Coach from February through to November. It's been another productive and fulfilling season, my second in this role, allowing me to build good knowledge and relationships with many of you throughout our vast region. On average I travelled between 500and 700 kilometres a week, teaching our wonderful game to players of all levels.

Coming into this season, a major focus of mine (as with my Elite Performance role) was to expose the game to as many people as I could throughout our entire region, enabling them to experience a reasonable level of coaching, whether a beginner or an elite player. Likewise for coaches, passing on my thirty nine years of squash playing experience, thirty six as a 'A' grade player and thirty one as a coach in many capacities from club to national level. My coaching philosophy is simple: I'll coach anyone no matter what level as long as they are keen to learn, listen and have a good attitude.

If successful in the role for the forthcoming season, I plan to schedule out a ten month calendar planning well ahead of time where I will be and what I will be available for when it comes to coaching delivery.

Looking back on the season some of the milestones for me included:

- Junior Development Camps; these moved into our second year and were reintroduced after a ten year hiatus. These camps were mainly focused on our nine to thirteen year olds, giving them the opportunity to practice / train in a semi-formal environment with their peers in preparation for them moving onto District, National and International camps. These camps gave opportunities to a new lot of young players from outside of the main centres, hopefully holding their interest in the game and keeping them motivated to carry on during a period when they otherwise would not be active in squash. A big thank you goes out to Grant Watts, Jordan Bell, Kaitlyn Watts and Loni Martin for their support during the camps, as well as the SquashGym and Whanganui Squash Clubs for the use of their facilities.
- Player depth at Junior Level; the Prince Series is a great breeding ground for the development of our young player depth, something I have experienced over the past three seasons, with many of the players moving into the senior ranks attaining E grade and record numbers appearing throughout the series. A handful of these players have also moved on to achieve high national age group rankings and with the introduction of our junior development camps the plan is to see this continue well into the future.
- AIMS Games; the premier sporting event for intermediate age kids seeing some 10,000 plus children take part in the week-long event in Tauranga during the school holidays across a variety of codes. It was excellent to see a few of our juniors contest the event this year.
- Super Champs; arguably our sport's best product for young and old, bringing club members together to play their peers to see who's the best of the best. Congratulations to the following teams for making their respective national finals: B grade - SquashGym / Whanganui C: Whanganui / Hawera D: Ohakune / Kawaroa Park E: Hawera / Dannevirke F: Tararua / Tararua.
- Champion of Champions; 83 players contested this year's event making it one of the biggest in recent times, exciting times ahead as Central players go on to contest the national Champion of Champions at Ohakune in late October, last year Squash Central won the inaugural District Teams Event.
- Give Squash a Go; As part of my District role I delivered this unique program thanks to the Whanganui Squash Club to a keen bunch of beginner juniors over a four week period. This program targeted kids that had never or barely been near a squash court before. At the conclusion of this these kids could move on to the club's junior night.
- Zone Squads; a squad training initiative aimed at players on the cusp of representing the District at a senior level. The Taranaki Regions squad grew in numbers and it is an initiative we will review moving into the new season.

- Central Doubles; Great numbers and competitively contested across all levels at the Whanganui Squash Club.
- Local tournaments; Moving around the District this year, I noticed a real resurgence in our sport. This was highlighted by many clubs experiencing an uptake of numbers contesting their local tournaments.
- Coaching appointments; Fantastic to see SquashGym appointing a club coach in Victor Romero as well as Jason Fletcher sitting in the role of Coaching Director for World Squash Federation in the Pan Pacific Region, attending the world coaching conference on the Gold Coast where he was one of the presenters. I was also fortunate enough to be a guest presenter at the NZ Coaching conference earlier in the year on 'grassroots squash' and to be formally appointed as Squash Fiji's Overseas Technical Expert overseeing their national squads that are to contest the Pacific games in Samoa in July 2019. It has been very encouraging to witness the growing depth of club coaches both practically and when it comes to personal development, seeing eight of our Central coaches attend this year's national coaching conference.
- Health of club programs; Travelling throughout the District this year gave me a first-hand view of the clubs that ran great programs in: business house, club nights and juniors. Without naming anyone in particular it is a tribute to your volunteers, communities and club culture and no accident that these are thriving.

There are too many of you to name but I would like to thank everyone that I have had the privilege of working with this year, in the District Coaching role, for your support when working at your clubs. In particular to Pauline Slovak who does a wonderful job when it comes to booking of vehicles, accommodation, logistics, administration and organising player uniforms for our representative teams. She's a real champ that goes above and beyond for the District!

I wish you all a safe and prosperous New Year and hope to see you all around the traps during the 2019 season.

HIGH PERFORMANCE REPORT

It's been another extremely hectic season for our elite players individually and team- wise at a regional, national and international level. Looking over the results it goes without saying that as a District we produce some magnificent players and we are a great District to represent with a 'team' philosophy when it comes to culture that offers a very welcoming environment at training camps or when representing Central, This is something that we have worked hard on as a management team over the years.

What stands out for me this year, was giving representative exposure to many of our players within the District, seeing an abundance of new players from outside the main squash clubs come into the fray for the first time representing themselves, their families, clubs and our District with pride! One of my main focuses when I took on this role was to expose the game far and wide to every corner of the Region enabling as many players as possible to put their hand up to represent Central ultimately building player depth for the future. These players along with our incumbents displayed great attitudes and character, traits that have seen them represent the District proudly over an extended period. We may not have got outstanding placings at national teams events but I'm confident that we continued to build upon our strong culture and from my perspective it was a pleasure working with all and sundry.

Some of what we have undertaken and achieved this season include:

1 Day Senior Challenges:

- The Newbigin Shield at Havelock North versus Squash Eastern 16/8 to Eastern.
- Versus Waikato at Taumaranui 16/8 to Central, our first win in four years seeing a total of ten - five setters.

We're in current discussions with Squash Eastern and Wellington, where next season we're looking at reviving the triangular series to include Wellington at a date and venue to be confirmed. These challenges are vital to get exposure for our players to top level squash against players from outside our region. It also allows us to introduce new players in to the representative fold. Kudos goes to Grant Watts who has been an extremely dedicated and long serving top level coach for us in these clashes and many more over the years. Personally it is a pleasure working with him allowing me the opportunity to learn and grow as a coach at the same time.

Player / Team achievements:

- Kaitlyn Watts; our flagship player who is a magnificent ambassador for our District both on and off the court – Youth Olympics Ambassador in Argentina, NZ Junior Open winner, British / USA Juniors where she made the last 16, player of PSA tour events, NZ senior team representative at world teams in China, contested her 1st PSA final at Squash XL in Auckland, NZ world junior representative and NZ no.1 in India.
- Courtney Trail; opened the door for many of our young players to consider squash as
 a viable career path through the USA school system currently based in the USA on a
 scholarship NZ world junior representative in India Winner of the North Island under 19
 junior girls title.
- Anabel Romero; Winner of the NZ under 13 girls championships in her first year in this age group achieving a B2 grading at the age of 11 – Youngest ever junior girl to be awarded the most improved at the NZ Age Group Championships – member of the NZ Junior Development Squads.
- Allan Bailey; NZ representative at the World University Games in Birmingham.
- Annaleise Faint; Selected as a development player for the World Junior Championships in India – Co-Captain of the winning NZ Secondary Schools girls team versus Australia.
- Kashif Shuja; Winner of the Central Open and NZ Masters 35 age group.
- Brooke Reid, Anabel Romero, Reece Holmes and Genevieve Bell were all selected to attend the Squash NZ Development Camps.

- The SquashGym ladies team on winning the prestigious Mitchell Cup at Hamilton from a 5th seed position.
- All the players, administrators, volunteers and managers that have been nominated in their respective categories having succeeded at the local, regional, national and international level over the past twelve months at their Regional Sports Trust Award evening. This highlights that as a sport we are in very good shape moving into the future.

The Central management teams / convenors plans for the 2019 representative season include setting out a structure where we re-introduce a few selection events, player camps setting out a clear selection process for players that are available to contest the 1 day challenges and NZ team's events. These plans will be sent out to players early in the year so they can plan accordingly.

REVENUE

Affiliation and competition income is recorded once an invoice has been raised. Grants, donations and interest are recorded when they are received unless there is a condition attached in which case it is recognised as a liability until it is spent

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are stated at their net realisable value.

CLOTHING ON HAND

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, on a first in-first out basis.

FIXED ASSETS

All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation to date. Depreciation has been provided at the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 1994

INCOME TAX

The society is exempt from income tax as an amateur sports body under Section CW 46 of the Income Tax Act 2007

CONDITIONAL GRANTS

Grants received are recognised as income unless the specific conditions attached to them are not met. In these cases the grants are shown as a liability until the conditions are met

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown GST inclusive

INDEPENDENT ASSURANCE PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF CENTRAL SQUASH ASSOCIATION (INCORPORATED)

Report on the Special Purpose Financial Statements

We have reviewed the accompanying special purpose financial statements of Central Squash Association (Incorporated), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 September 2018, and the statement of financial performance and statement in movement in general funds for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Committee's Responsibility for the Special Purpose Financial Statements

The Committee is responsible for the preparation of these special purpose financial statements in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association and for such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying special purpose financial statements. We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ)) 2400, Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is not the Auditor of the Entity. ISRE (NZ) 2400 requires us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements, taken as a whole, are not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association. This Standard also requires us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of special purpose financial statements in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. The assurance practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained. The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these special purpose financial statements. Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Central Squash Association (Incorporated).

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

Control over income other than affiliation fees, grants and interest, prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical assurance procedures to determine the effect of these limited control. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to these amounts were necessary.

Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements of Central Squash Association (Incorporated) as at 30 September 2018, and its financial performance for the year then ended, are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association.

Emphasis of Matter

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to statement of accounting policies, which describes the basis of accounting. These are special purpose financial statements and have been prepared to meet the requirements of the members. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our conclusion not qualified in respect of this matter.

Restriction on Responsibility

This report is made solely to the members, as a body. Our review work has been undertaken so that we might state to the members those matters we are required to state to them in a reviewer's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the members as a body, for our review work, for this report, or for the conclusion we have formed.
