PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hello and Welcome to my 3rd President's report. And again, another year, another statement of intent. My famous last words of last year bouncing in my head!!!!

Well, we completed another 15 months (as SNZ changed the squash year) full of challenges for our committee, I had hoped that this year would continue to build on the base we as committee put together last year. In a lot of ways, we continued to evolve as a district but frustratingly we continue to struggle to attract coaches and a depth of players to represent our region on the National stage.

Last year was incredibly challenging not only for individuals but also for clubs, district organisations and squash in general. Nothing has changed!!!

Squash NZ has implemented change to our grading system to pull us in line with the rest of the squash world. Although very new to everyone, it won't take long for the playing contingent to get their heads around it and to be fair it won't really change a lot of players grades a lot we believe.

As Squash NZ continued to implement changes over the past year. CEO Martin Dowson has been very prominent in his quest to be more available to the clubs and regions. Again, a high point was the NZ Squash forum that Pauline and I attended in Christchurch. Even with clubs now functioning at pre covid levels, a cost of living crisis and a shift of culture within sport has seen a big push toward pay to play memberships or social memberships being taken up by players.

Full memberships are down but generally within our region, clubs are seeing growth in memberships overall. Social memberships are big business for a majority of clubs.

Tournaments, Super champs, Champ of Champs and many National events saw our members excel.

As I hinted earlier, Central Squash lacks coaches and mentors for our young members, this is a priority point for our committee. Our Juniors are our future and we have some fantastic talent amongst this group. While our junior numbers and talent pool remain quite good, from the age of 18 to 35 we lose a big percentage of players. We must guide and encourage our younger players to remain within the sport. There is a hole in the 18-35yr group which is a major concern to our sport and we need to find a way to address and kerb the flow of players that exit squash throughout this age group. Our national executive must take heed and implement change to stem the tide.

I must touch on the squad selections and importance of planning and managing teams. While our Junior and Masters teams competed at the nationals this year. We chose as a committee not to send a Senior squad away.

It was a decision we did not make lightly it was a decision we felt was right and we stand by our decision. We know there were some players that were not happy that we did not participate but we will not spend our members money and waste the time of coaches and management on an unprepared and under managed squad. However, through it all there were still many achievements and successes as you will see in the following reports, which goes to show just how resilient squash players are and what a great sport it is.

We continue to review own strategic direction our committee have the unenviable task of being the glue between player and administration. At times decisions have had to be made that some members have not liked. Long discussion has been had over decisions and I can honestly say that our committee take their jobs seriously and passionately and will back themselves to put their points forward. Please remember, our executive are all volunteers and are definitely not in it for the money!!

At times the stress on our committee has been immense and has possibly unfairly been placed on them. The 2020-2025 strategic plan remains a big priority for the next committee to focus on.

The 4 key areas of importance to Central Squash are:

- 1. Encouraging and growing participation
- 2. Development of members, coaches, players and referees,
- 3. Capability
- 4. Communication and Marketing

A big thank you to all the staff, coaches, managers, and volunteers who have all been involved in Squash Central. There were some great ideas and support from these people during the year to keep everyone motivated and active.

The Calendar is looking very full and exciting for Central Squash 2024 including hosting some national events. Squashgym host the New Zealand Junior Open, Whanganui the Masters Club Teams Championships and Kawaroa Park the E Grade National Super Champs.

I would like to thank the Committee for their efforts this year, they all quickly adapted to many emails and zoom meetings. Our Committee continue to be a very tight unit. Our Team was very thoughtful and considerate on some very tough topics of discussion and decisions being made throughout the year. We are lucky to have such a unified and skilled committee and I appreciate the depth of the committee's knowledge which has proved valuable on many occasions. As we grew as a team more and more frank discussions were had, I am so thankful that all our committee took on the 'Open Door' policy.

Many thanks to Joy Littlejohn who as Vice Chair and continues to be my sounding board. Of course Joy puts up with my uneducated outlook on life and my arguably very limited knowledge of top squash. Joy organised the Masters and is our Masters convenor.

Squash central is lucky to have Pauline Chapman and we thank her for the hours and hours of work behind the scenes in keeping the squash wheels turning as our Super Administrator.

Pauline Waite has had the arduous task of balancing our books, as you know our budget is tight, Between the two Pauline's we walk the tight rope of funding, funding allocations, applications etc. So much behind the scenes work goes into keeping our teams and our zones funded and ready for battle.

To John Laurenson who puts together the tricky puzzle that is the calendar each year. I have witnessed the frustrations John goes through and no wonder he pulls his hair out with some of the changes that are asked for.

Anneka Weterman was the Communications Representative and has done a fabulous job connecting members to what is happening in the district through our media platforms' and along with Pauline has continued to be instrumental in getting Central Districts involved in World Squash Day and many other projects.

Daryl O'Hara, has taken over the sponsorship role on committee, Not, an easy position but Daryl has made head way and procured sponsorship for Central Squash going forward. Well Done Daryl!

To Brett Cooke, Cindy Marsh, Natalie Lane, Virginia Laws, and Amy Simpson, I owe a debt of gratitude, you guys are the stabilisers, not shy in doing the hard yards and forthcoming with advice and support to all committee when needed.

JUNIOR CONVENER'S REPORT

One Day Representative Challenges

Our district junior rep team had successful challenges against both Eastern and Wellington Districts to bring the trophies home to Central.

Eastern

On Sunday 12th February a team of 20 Central juniors made their way to Hastings Tennis and Squash Club for the annual Central v Eastern Junior One Day Challenge. We welcomed 8 new juniors to the team from around the district to join the 12 who have had the honour of representing Central previously.

Despite the looming cyclone Gabrielle threat, we were able to complete the day's games and proudly bring the trophy home for the 5th year running. Central had an early close lead after round one by 2 games. Round two was even as we headed into the final 2 games played by our team captains Grace Burnard (Ohakune) and Brodie Bennett (Tararua). Both had outstanding tough battles with Grace taking the win 5. Brodie who was playing up 2 age groups and a higher graded opponent took the win also in 5 to secure the overall win for the Central Team. This was a great start to the season for our juniors, after the summer break.

Wellington

Squashgym hosted the Central v Wellington Junior One Day Representative challenge on Sunday 26th February. It was great to see this competition played again as due to covid interruptions it hasn't been challenged since 2019. Four players from each age group (2 male + 2 female) competed in a busy day of squash, with excellent sportsmanship and skills on display. Central took an early strong lead which they were able to maintain during round 2 to win the trophy.

The National Junior Team travelled to Hutt City to compete in the National Individual and Teams event at the end of October. In the Individual event, Central had 17 young players from across the region represent us. The majority of the players either equaled or improved their original seedings, with only 4 dropping. Great to see the Central players are playing on par with their peers. Central took out both the U17 titles, with Anabel Romero-Gemmell (Squashgym) taking the girls title and Brodie Bennett taking the boys title after a big battle against fellow Central player Maximus Mathews (Whanganui).

In the teams event, Central Boys who were seeded 6th, improved their seeding after an upset win over the 3rd seeded Auckland (on count-back), finishing in 4th place. The Central Girls maintained their 3rd place seeding.

The young Central players all conducted themselves on and off the court with good sportsmanship and behaviour and it was a pleasure to accompany them to the National event. Thank you also to coaches Matt Laurenson and Tamsyn Leevey who travelled away with the team, providing coaching and mentoring throughout the event.

Central Junior Open & Prince Series Prize giving In July, Ohakune Squash Club hosted the Central Junior Open over a two day event, which combined with the Junior Prince Finale. This made for a very busy weekend, as many Central juniors came together to play in the two events. Many thanks to John and the Ohakune team for their efforts in hosting the successful event. Brodie Bennett and Isla Sweeney (Squashgym) were the respective Boys and Girls Central Junior Champions for 2023. The Prince Series wrapped up after 16 rounds and came to a 2 point difference separating the winner Tahlia Kean (Squashgym) from Jack Richardson (Hunterville).

North Island Junior Age Groups

In July 2023 Whanganui Squash Club hosted the North Island Junior Age Champs, a massive event with 120 young players from around New Zealand participating in the 3 day event. Was great to see Central had good representation numbers at the event, with several strong contenders. Although several Central players took the podium, Alexia Laws (Dannevirke) was the only Central Squash player to take a title, winning the U11 girls title. Brodie Bennett was runner up of U17 boys and



Jake Laws runner up of U13 boys. A wonderful effort from Anneka and the team at Whanganui for hosting such a large and successful event.

Central Prize Giving - Nice to see our district's junior players being recognised at the Central Prize Giving in October 2023. Congratulations to Maximus Mathews (Whanganui) receiving Player of the Year after a successful season, and the Most Improved Junior Player Toby Freyria (KP) with a whopping points movement of 1350.

Junior achievements:

August 2023 Secondary Schools Squash Team Champs - Brodie Bennett (Tararua) was named as number 1 Junior Boy for Secondary Schools Squash Teams Champs. Sam Watson (Stratford), Maximus Mathews (Whanganui) and Taylah-Chae Collier (KP) were also named as non travelling reserves. The team was successful in winning. December 2023 NZ Junior Trans-Tasman Test Series - Brodie, Maximus and Anabel were all named in the New Zealand team which went on to win the series.

Dec 2023 Oceania Junior Championships - A massive congratulations to Brodie Bennett who took the U17 Boys title in Tauranga, with Maximus Mathews coming in at 4th.

Dec 2023 - US Squash Junior Open Championships - Anabel Romero-Gemmell travelled to the US to compete in the 2023 U.S. Junior Open which fielded 1,019 players representing forty-five nations making it the world's largest Individual Squash Tournament. Anabel finished in the top 25 for her U17 age group.

The 2024 season ahead looks set to be another busy and successful season for our Central Junior Players. Congratulations to Brodie, Maximus and Anabel who have all been named in the New Zealand Junior Squad and to Thor Darlington (Whanganui) and Sam Watson who are in the NZ regional training squads. Good luck to everyone for the season ahead. I look forward to catching up with everyone at a squash club soon.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the Annual Financial report for the 2022/23 year, due to the change in balance date our figures for the annual report are for a 15 month period.

Expenditure was in line with the budget plus the additional income of 3 months of Affiliation fees meant we have made a profit.

Our cash holdings in the BNZ total \$82,188.46 plus Term Deposits of \$23,792.27.

We were once again fortunate to secure \$48,000 in grants from NZCT, Toi Foundation, Grassroots Trust, Pelorus Trust, Pub Charity Trust and the Aotearoa Gaming Trust – these were used to cover wages, coaching and national team expenses. Sadly as we didn't send a team to the senior nationals some monies had to be returned.

The budget for 2024 is based on 2023 figures and is for a 12 month period, we hope to have similar success with grant applications.

Thanks to Jeff See, Pauline Chapman and the Committee for their support during the past year.

INDEPENDENT ASSURANCE PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF CENTRAL SQUASH ASSOCIATION (INCORPORATED)

Report on the Special Purpose Financial Statements

We have reviewed the special purpose financial statements on pages 1 to 6 of Central Squash Association (Incorporated), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2023, and the statement of financial performance and statement of movement in general funds for the fifteen months then ended, and notes to the financial statements.

Committee's Responsibility for the Special Purpose Financial Statements

The Committee is responsible for the preparation of these special purpose financial statements in accordance with the accounting policies of the society and for such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying special purpose financial statements. We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ)) 2400, Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is not the Auditor of the Entity. ISRE (NZ) 2400 requires us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements, taken as a whole, are not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the accounting policies of the society. This standard also requires us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of special purpose financial statements in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. The assurance practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained. The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these special purpose financial statements. Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Central Squash Association (Incorporated).

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

Control over income other than affiliation fees, grants and interest, prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical assurance procedures to determine the effect of these limited control. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to these amounts or their related balances were necessary.

Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements of Central Squash Association (Incorporated) as at 31 December 2023, and its financial performance for the fifteen months then ended, are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting policies of the society.





Emphasis of Matter

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to statement of accounting policies, which describes the basis of accounting. These are special purpose financial statements and have been prepared in accordance with the policies determined by the Committee for the benefit of the members. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our conclusion is not qualified in respect of this matter.

Restriction on Responsibility

This report is made solely to the Members, as a body. Our review work has been undertaken so that we might state to the committee those matters we are required to state to them in a reviewer's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the members as a body, for our review work, for this report, or for the conclusion we have formed.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Central Squash Association (Incorporated) is an incorporated society, registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with policies determined by the Board for the benefit of the members.

These financial statements do not include the activities or balances of the Central Squash Trust

MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical basis are followed by the entity.

SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied.

REVENUE

Affiliation and competition income is recorded once an invoice has been raised. Grants, donations and interest are recorded when they are received unless there is a condition attached in which case it is recognised as a liability until it is spent

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are stated at their net realisable value.

CLOTHING ON HAND

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, on a first in-first out basis.

FIXED ASSETS

All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation to date. Depreciation has been provided at the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 2007

INCOME TAX

The society is exempt from income tax as an amateur sports body under Section CW 46 of the Income Tax Act 2007

CONDITIONAL GRANTS

Grants received are recognised as income unless the specific conditions attached to them are not met. In these cases the grants are shown as a liability until the conditions are met

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown GST inclusive

DEBENTURE

The Debenture issued to Squashgym Palmerston North is stated at cost (refer note 8)

NETTING OFF

Some activities in the statement of finacial performance are disclosed on a net basis with the breakdown of income and expenditure disclosed in the notes to the statements as this is thought to be more meaningful to members

CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

There has been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a consistent basis with the previous year. The financial year end date was changed to 31 December to align with Squash New Zealand requirements
